Reverse the Revolving Door of SUD

Exaggerate

Some think: Patients with addiction problems **exaggerate** their symptoms of pain because they are **drug seeking**.

Reality: At best, they can stave off withdrawal, an experience often feared.

Choice

Some think: Substance abuse is a voluntary **choice**.

Reality: In the beginning, the person may start as a voluntary user; however, the behavior eventually becomes **compulsive** and uncontrollable.

Character Flaw

Some think: People with addiction have a **defective** or **selfish personality.**

Reality: Addiction was originally framed as a form of antisocial personality disorder, but **research** does not support this idea.

Rock Bottom

Some think: Substance abusers have to hit **"rock bottom"** in order to want help **Reality:** The **earlier** the treatment is administered the **better** because waiting could cost the person his or her life.

Hopeless

Some think: Helping addicts who continue to have **recurring relapses** is **pointless** because their case is **hopeless**.

Reality: Treatment for substance abuse is ongoing and relapse shows that they tried.
